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Bowie-Austin FFA Chapter Constitution

ARTICLE I - Name, Mission and Strategies

Section A. The name of this organization shall be the Bowie-Austin FFA Chapter of the National FFA Organization.

Section B. The mission and strategies for this chapter are as follows:

FFA makes a **positive difference** in the lives of students by developing their potential for **premier leadership, personal growth** and **career success** through **agricultural education**.

1. Develops competent and assertive agricultural leadership.
2. Increases awareness of the global and technological importance of agriculture and its contribution to our well-being.
3. Strengthens the confidence of agriculture students in themselves and their work.
4. Promotes the intelligent choice and establishment of an agricultural career.
5. Encourages achievement in supervised agricultural experience programs.
6. Encourages wise management of economic, environmental and human resources of the community.
7. Develops interpersonal skills in teamwork, communications, human relations and social interaction.
8. Builds character and promotes citizenship, volunteerism and patriotism.
9. Promotes cooperation and cooperative attitudes among all people.
10. Promotes healthy lifestyles.
11. Encourages excellence in scholarship.

ARTICLE II - Organization

Section A. The Bowie-Austin Chapter of FFA is a chartered local unit of the Texas Association of FFA, which is chartered by the National FFA Organization.

Section B. This chapter accepts in full the provisions in the constitution and bylaws of the Association of FFA as well as those of the National FFA Organization.

ARTICLE III - Membership

Section A. Membership in this chapter shall be of three kinds: (1) Active; (2) Alumni; and (3) Honorary, as defined by the National FFA Constitution.

Section B. The regular activities of this chapter shall be carried on by the active membership.

Section C. Honorary membership in this chapter shall be limited to the Honorary Chapter FFA Degree.

Section D. Active members in good standing may vote on all business brought before the chapter. An active member shall be considered in good standing when:

1. While in school, be enrolled in at least one agricultural education course per semester. The course must include a supervised agricultural experience program, the objective of which is preparation for an agricultural career.
2. Show an interest in the affairs of the organization by attending meetings, striving for degrees of membership, and participating in other organized activities of the chapter.
3. Each member may only miss up to two meetings throughout the year unless written documentation can be given before the meeting to be missed, explaining why the meeting will be missed. If a student misses more than two meetings, they are not allowed to show or be on teams due to lack of involvement with the organization. Excused meetings are: College Classes at night, other extracurricular activities that you cannot miss due to a competition. Prior approval by Agricultural Science Instructors only, is needed for anything else.
4. Pay all current state and national dues by the date determined by the chapter.
5. Display conduct consistent with the ideals and purposes of the National FFA Organization, AISD, and Bowie High School.
6. Jr. Bowie-Austin FFA members must be 3rd grade and eight years of age at a minimum and be enrolled in a feeder school of Bowie High School. Any current Jr. Member that does not meet these requirements, must be in good standing with the Bowie-Austin FFA, will be grandfathered in.
7. All membership guidelines apply to Bowie-Austin FFA Jr. Members.

ARTICLE IV - Emblems

Section A. The emblem of the FFA shall be the emblem for the chapter.

Section B. Emblems used by the members shall be designated by the National FFA Organization.

ARTICLE V - Degrees and Privileges of Active Membership

Section A. There shall be five degrees of active membership based on individual achievement. These degrees are: (1) Discovery FFA Degree, (2) Greenhand FFA Degree, (3) Chapter FFA Degree, (4) State FFA Degree and (5) American FFA Degree. All Discovery FFA members are entitled to wear the regulation bronze and blue emblem pin. All "Greenhands" are entitled to wear the regulation bronze emblem pin. All members holding the Chapter FFA Degree are entitled to wear the regulation silver emblem pin. All members holding the State FFA Degree are entitled to wear the regulation gold emblem charm. All members holding the American FFA Degree are entitled to wear the regulation gold emblem key.

Section B. Discovery FFA Degree – To be eligible to receive the Discovery FFA Degree from a chapter, the member must meet the following minimum requirements:

1. Be enrolled in agricultural education class for at least a portion of the school year while in grades 7-8.
2. Have become a dues paying member of the FFA at local, state and national levels.
3. Participate in at least one local FFA chapter activity outside of scheduled class time.

4. Have knowledge of agriculturally related career, ownership and entrepreneurial opportunities.
5. Be familiar with the local FFA chapter program of activities.
6. Submit written applications for the degree.

Section C. Greenhand FFA Degree. Minimum qualifications for election:
(Refer to National Constitution.)

1. Be enrolled in agricultural education and have satisfactory plans for a supervised agricultural experience program.
2. Learn and explain the meaning of the FFA Creed, Motto, and Salute.
3. Describe and explain the meaning of the FFA emblem and colors.
4. Demonstrate knowledge of the FFA Code of Ethics and the proper use of the FFA jacket.
5. Demonstrate knowledge of the history of the organization, the chapter constitution and bylaws, and the chapter Program of Activities.
6. Personally own or have access to the Official FFA Manual and the FFA Student Handbook.
7. Submit a written application for the Greenhand FFA Degree.

Section D. Chapter FFA Degree. Minimum qualifications for election:
(Refer to National Constitution.)

1. Must have received the Greenhand FFA Degree.
2. Must have satisfactorily completed the equivalent of at least 180 hours of systematic school instruction in agricultural education at or above the ninth grade level, have in operation an approved supervised agricultural experience program and be enrolled in an agricultural education course.
3. Must have participated in the planning and conducting of at least three official functions in the chapter Program of Activities.
4. Must have earned and productively invested at least \$150 by the member's own efforts or worked at least forty-five hours in excess of scheduled class time, or a combination thereof, and have developed plans for continued growth and improvement in a supervised agricultural experience program.
5. Must have effectively led a group discussion for 15 minutes.
6. Must have demonstrated five procedures of parliamentary law.
7. Must show progress toward individual achievement in the FFA award programs.
8. Must have a satisfactory scholastic record.
9. Must submit a written application for the Chapter FFA Degree.

Section E. State FFA Degree. Minimum qualifications for selection:

1. Qualifications for the State FFA Degree are those set forth in the constitution of the state FFA association and National FFA Organization.

Section F. American FFA Degree. Minimum qualifications for selection:

1. Qualifications for the American FFA Degree are those set forth in the constitution of the National FFA Organization.

ARTICLE VI - Chapter Officers

Section A. The offices of an FFA chapter shall be: president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, reporter, sentinel, and junior advisor. Other officers may be elected as deemed appropriate by the local advisor and/or governing body. The teacher(s) of agricultural education shall be the FFA advisor(s).

Section B. Officer selection process will be as follows:

- Application will be handed out at the February meeting and will need to be turned in by the first Monday in April. The application will need to be correctly filled out with all signatures and is worth 20pts.
- Interview by judges 50pts. Students will need to do the speech in front of the judges. Points off if not in correct official dress deemed by judges. Judges will be agricultural science teachers, educators, or community members selected by the Bowie Agricultural Science Instructors.
- Test over Parliamentary Procedure and FFA 20pts.
- Chapter vote at April meeting 10pts.

Rank is determined by point totals. Ties are broken by the member who scores higher in the interview.

ARTICLE VII - Dues

Section A. Local dues in this chapter are \$20 for Bowie-Austin FFA members and \$10 for Bowie-Austin FFA Jr. members. Dues can change if there is an increase of the amount paid to District, Area, or State FFA. Dues are to be paid by deadline set by Agricultural Science Instructors.

Section B. Full local, state and national dues shall be paid by all active members.

Section C. No member shall be considered as active and in good standing unless he/she pays full local, state and national FFA dues.

ARTICLE VIII - Amendments

Section A. This constitution may be amended or changed at any regular chapter meeting by a two-thirds vote of the active members present providing it is not in conflict with the state association constitution or that of the National FFA Organization.

Section B. Bylaws may be adopted to fit the needs of the chapter at any regular chapter meeting by a two-thirds vote of the active members present providing such bylaws do not conflict in any way with the constitution and bylaws of either the state association or the national organization.

Bowie – Austin FFA Membership Contract

The following expectations will be in effect for FFA events such as chapter meetings, conventions at all levels, greenhand camps, and all other FFA sanctioned events.

Bowie-Austin FFA General Membership Expectations

1. FFA membership expectations and guidelines are found in the Bowie-Austin FFA Chapter Constitution.
2. Each member may only miss up to two meetings throughout the year unless written documentation can be given before the meeting to be missed, explaining why the meeting will be missed. If a student misses more than two meetings, they are not allowed to show or be on teams due to lack of involvement with the organization. Excused meetings are: College Classes at night, other extracurricular activities that you cannot miss due to a competition. Prior approval by Agricultural Science Instructors only, is needed for anything else.
3. Inappropriate behavior during the meeting can result in the member being asked to leave the room. If the student is asked to leave the room, that meeting will go towards one of their two missed meetings.
4. All AISD, Bowie High School and FFA policies apply including but not limited to discipline / behavior, dress code, and eligibility rules apply to every FFA sanctioned event.

Bowie – Austin FFA Leadership Development Events & Career Development Teams Contract

Thank you for wanting to join one of the Bowie-Austin FFA Career Development Teams. This is a contract to remind you of the importance of participating on a team. You will need this to help earn a letterman jacket and obtain degrees and scholarships. Leadership teams are important because they promote, “Premier Leadership, personal growth, and career success.” (National FFA Manual).

- 1. The FFA member must attend every mandatory team meetings. If more than one is missed, the member is off the team.**
- 2. Each member may only miss up to two meetings throughout the year unless written documentation can be given before the meeting to be missed, explaining why the meeting will be missed. If a student misses more than two meetings, they are not allowed to show or be on teams due to lack of involvement with the organization. Excused meetings are: College Classes at night, other extracurricular activities that you cannot miss due to a competition. Prior approval by Agricultural Science Instructors only, is needed for anything else.**
- 3. National FFA rules determine the number of members that compete on a team. It will be the decision of the associated Ag Science Instructor to determine who competes and who is an alternate for any FFA team contests.**
- 4. All AISD, Bowie High School and Bowie FFA policies apply including but not limited to discipline / behavior, dress code, and eligibility rules.**

Practice Time: To be decided by the Agricultural Science Instructor in charge of that team.

Contest Dates: Will be provided to the students when team training begins.

Contest Dress: Students are to wear Official Dress for Leadership Development Events (fall) unless it is Ag. Skills team. Students are to wear jeans or slacks, and button-down collards shirt, and closed-toed shoes matching school dress policy for the spring teams.

Bowie FFA Officer & Greenhand Officer Code of Conduct

The terms set forth in this document will outline the appropriate behavior of a Bowie FFA Officer in school, at extracurricular activities, and any time out of school:

1. Bowie FFA Officers (and Greenhand officers) are to present themselves as role models and respect their fellow FFA members and other students as representatives of Bowie FFA as long as they remain in their designated office, as elected by their peers.
2. Each officer (including Greenhand Officers) must maintain a "B" average or above (3.0 GPA) in Vocational Agriculture classes. Each officer must maintain a 2.0 or better overall GPA. Grades will be checked each six weeks during their term of office for eligibility.
3. Any officer (including Greenhand officers) who fails a class, based on AISD and/or TEA UIL "no pass, no play" rules will be placed on probation and if repeated at any time that semester will be removed from their office and executive committee.
4. Any officer (including Greenhand officers) that has legal action taken against them in or outside of school (any misdemeanor or felony excluding traffic violations) will be automatically removed from their office and executive committee.
5. Any officer (including Greenhand officers) who is subject to disciplinary action by the campus administration, which results in suspension from school or being sent to the ALC, will be removed from their office and the executive committee.
6. Newly elected officers must know their opening and closing ceremony parts for each meeting and meeting assignments. Greenhand officers are expected to know the opening and closing ceremonies for the December meeting and are expected to help at the FFA Banquet.
7. Any officer cannot miss more than two officer and/or chapter meetings and maintain their office. If officer in question feels they have extenuating circumstances they may appeal to the teachers and Executive committee made up of the officer team.
8. Officers will wear official dress at all FFA Meetings. Greenhand officers will be expected to wear official dress at the December meeting and the FFA banquet.

Attendance

Students will need to let the Agricultural Science Instructors know that they are going to Travis County Stock show, San Antonio Stock show validations, Career Development Event, Leadership Development Event, or all other FFA related activity three days prior to the trip. If the Fieldtrip form, attached, is not turned in three days prior to the event, the student will not be field tripped through Bowie-Austin FFA. If you are not in attendance at these events, it will be an unexcused absence.

The student will need to submit the following form to the agricultural science instructor three days or more prior to the event to be excused with Bowie-Austin FFA. If the attached Fieldtrip form is not turned in three days prior to the event, the student will not be field tripped through Bowie-Austin FFA. (Ex. If the day to be gone is Friday, we must have the form by Tuesday.) Ten of these forms have been provided.

1. ____ **Currently in the FFA program and a member for at least two years.**
2. ____ **Completed 300 hours (four semesters) of ag coursework with a B average or higher.**
3. ____ **Earned a Chapter FFA Degree.**
4. ____ **Participated in at least two LDE Competitions at District or higher levels.**
5. ____ **Participated in at least two CDE competitions at District or higher levels.**
6. ____ **In good academic standing with a 2.0 GPA or higher at time of application.**
7. ____ **No history of disciplinary action by the campus administration which resulted in suspension from school or being sent to the ALC.**
8. ____ **Attended a district, area, & state convention, each at least once.**
9. ____ **In good standing in accordance with the FFA Membership Contract.**
10. ____ **Events, teams, and other FFA activities mentioned above are documented in SAE record book for review.**

Note: The letterman jacket can be earned through FFA but it is up to the student to cover the cost.

Bowie FFA and AKIN FARM RULES

These rules are subject to change at any time

- 1. FEEDING HOURS** - Animals are to be fed between the hours of 7:00am to 9:00pm Monday through Sunday. If you need to feed outside of these hours you must be with your parents. The Agricultural Science Instructors must approve any alteration of feeding times.
- 2. MEDICATION & VETERINARY ASSISTANCE** – It is the student and or parents responsibility to arrange or administer medication and or veterinary services. All medications are to be stored off Bowie High School property.
- 3. ANIMAL CARE** - ANY animal neglected, abandoned, or abused shall be removed from the farm at the owners expense after one written notification from the Agricultural Science Instructor. Copies of said warning will be sent to the parents of said student and will be reported to the proper authorities. Any student failing to care for animals will be required to remove their animals from the farm and forfeit the lease.
- 4. ILLEGAL DRUGS FOR ANIMALS** - Any student using illegal drugs on animals, will be removed from the FFA program for the remainder of their high school career.
- 5. PARKING** - Student and Parent vehicles are only allowed to park in designated areas of the farm. Mrs. Akins's house and rent houses are off limits to all students unless otherwise instructed. Parking is not allowed in front of the tower due to maintenance workers coming in to work on the tower.
- 6. SPEED LIMIT** - all Students and Parents shall observe a speed limit of **10 MPH** while on the farm, vehicles must stay on the roads at all times, failure to do so can result in removal from the farm.
- 7. FARM GATES** – Any and all gates need to be kept closed and locked. This is for the safety of the animals and students.
- 8. ANIMAL BEHAVIOR** – Any animal deemed as unsafe, unacceptable behavior, by the Agricultural Science Instructor may be removed at the expense of the student and or parent within 24hrs. of a written notification by the Agricultural Science Instructor. Copies of the notification will be sent to the parents of said student.
- 9. PERSONAL PROPERTY** - Personal property stored on the Ag farm is not available for public use unless you have obtained permission from the owner of said property. "If it's not yours, leave it alone."
- 10. DESIGNATED DUMPING AREAS** - Feed, manure and hay are to be dumped in the front trash bin by the hog barn. If you are uncertain where the designated areas are, ask. Chickens that had deceased need to be put into a sack such as a feed sack before being placed into the front trash bin. Pen areas must be kept clean. Pens must be cleaned three times a week. If there is a major problem, you will not be allowed to have animals on the farm facility.
- 11. LEFT OVER EQUIPMENT** - All animals, any feed cans, buckets, ramps, show boxes etc. that are not removed from the Ag farm within Thirty (30) days after the last livestock show attended by that student, will become the property of the Alumni Association and will be made available to in-coming students the following year. All trailers will need to be removed within 30 days after graduation. Other arrangements are to be made in writing to the Agricultural Science Instructors.

12. **FARM** – Anyone that is not associated with the Bowie-Austin FFA program and does not currently have an animal on the farm, will need 48 hour prior approval or more by the Agricultural Science Instructors. Approval will need to be done during school hours to enter the farm.
13. **PEN MODIFICATION and REPAIRS** - All modifications and repairs to pens on the farm, must have prior approval of the Agriculture Science Instructor.
14. **HOUSING** - Animals will be housed at the Bowie/Akin Farm or at the student's home. Any exceptions to housing of animals need to come before the Agriculture Science Instructors. Instructors will not supervise projects outside of the Bowie District without special conditions and permission of AISD and Travis County Executive Committee. For animals to be housed at the Akins/Bowie FFA farm the students must be an active member in good standing of the Bowie FFA program and the animal must be registered under Bowie-Austin FFA. Exceptions to housing animals must be approved by the Agricultural Science Instructors and the campus administration.
15. **MAINTENANCE** - The pen, shed and any feed rooms must be maintained and turned back in a condition satisfactory to the Agricultural Science Instructor. Any needed repairs will be at the expense of the lessee. In the case of a Jr. Member who does not keep the pen clean or does not return the pen in the same condition or clean pen by the end of the year, they will be denied the privilege of keeping animals at the farm.
16. **USE OF EQUIPMENT** – All supplies and equipment owned by the Alumni will need approval by the Alumni Board. Trailers are not to be hauled by students and only by parents when approved by the Alumni Board. Using the trailer without the permission of the Alumni Board will result in those individuals not being allowed to use them again. When hauling an alumni trailer one must have insurance that covers the trailers, or they will not be allowed to use them.
18. **WEIGH DAYS** - Students are expected to weigh their animal and keep a record of weights and feeding amounts up to five entries worth in order to show the Agricultural Science Instructors on weigh day. All animals should be weighed and questions asked to the Agricultural Science Instructors by 5:30pm on weigh days. Weigh days will be on Tuesdays from 4:00pm to 5:30pm beginning the second week of school until the last week of the San Antonio Stock show, except on holidays. All other questions or appointments can be made before or after school during the weekdays only.
19. **STOCKSHOW AG. INSTRUCTOR ATTENDENCE**- Agricultural science instructors will only be attending Travis County and San Antonio Stock Shows. Students wishing to go to other stock shows besides Travis County and San Antonio Stock Show will need to fill out the Parental/Guardian Consent Form and Liability Waiver and turn it in 10 days before the stock show.
20. **ABUSE** - Any student abusing any person, animal or leased facility will be required to remove animals from farm and forfeit lease. Any misconduct by a student not in accordance with the FFA code of ethics will be required to remove their animals from the farm and forfeit lease.
21. Failure to adhere and abide by the above provision and all AISD rules, will constitute breach-of-contract and authorize the Agriculture Science Instructor or their agent to deliver any or all animals on the premises to the nearest auction and sold in the lessee's name. In such cases a hauling fee of \$100.00 will be assessed to the lessee.
22. **All AISD, Bowie High School and FFA policies apply.**

23. Any violation of district policy and/or farm rules will be subject to disciplinary action which could lead to the removal of your animal from the facility solely by Agricultural Science Instructors and/or James Bowie High School administration.
